#### About Ariel

Ariel's musical journey began at 6 years old when she met Ron Patterson, founder of IPOP (International Presentation of Performers). Through his mentorship and others at IPOP and National American Miss she got experience in acting, modeling and singing.

She started singing when she was 4 and began taking vocal lessons from her preschool teacher, Wilitez Katie Poirier (A & W Studios). Her first public performance was at a pageant when she was 5. She sings in the Valley by request and has been in fashion shows.

"I was very nervous the first time in front of so many people," Ariel said. She has participated in many competitions like National American Miss and IPOP. "IPOP has helped me tremendously with my self confidence and I appreciate the love and support of everyone there for the past 8 years," she added.

Ariel has won singing and modeling competitions at IPOP. She has trained with actors at IPOP and been in their shows for many years. She even got the chance to be a lead voice over for Justice Angel, an animated series in 2021.

"I want to be a singer and an actor and be in movies. I've been taking acting for two years," Ariel said. "I love to model and do runway walks in beautiful clothes for IPOP and various events."

Last year she reached a new milestone. As she performed in Nashville as part of the Josie Music Awards weekend a music producer was in the audience. Curt Ryle, co-owner of Clarksville Creative Sound, was there with some of the CCS artists and heard Ariel perform "Mama." He said he was mesmerized by her voice.

"She's only 13 so she has plenty of time to mature as an artist but I see Ariel being a huge star one day," Curt said in a recent interview. He has recorded and released two songs with Ariel so far this year. An album is in production. Ariel is likely to be part of a new project by CCS, a TV show "Small Town Sound" to air on the newly formed American Country Network.

Her creativity isn't limited to music as she also enjoys drawing, dancing and she plans to take piano and guitar lessons this summer. She plays volleyball and sings at assisted living homes to capture their hearts with her golden voice.
